Description of the activity

The course aims to delve into the musical interpretation of one of the few manuscripts of the Iberian Peninsula that conveys evidence of late medieval music in the context of the pilgrimage: the Llibre Vermell de Montserrat.

This course combines musical performance practice with the knowledge about this manuscript and its context. Therefore, there are two focuses of attention: the context of the pilgrimage and the performance practice on period instruments.

Objectives

- To learn the necessary techniques to perform works contained in the Llibre Vermell de Montserrat with medieval instruments or with the voice.
- To encounter the knowledge and experience of performers specialized in medieval music through voice or instrument classes (fiddle, harp, portative organ, citole, guiterne, hurdy-gurdy, percussion, recorder).
- To learn about the medieval context of the pilgrimage and the function of the music of the Llibre Vermell thanks to lectures by specialists in pilgrimage, art, literature and medieval music.
- To identify the historical musical notation of the Llibre Vermell and its characteristics in order to decipher it from the manuscript.
- To approach the world of the reconstruction of instruments of the period through the guidance of instrument makers and performers specialized in medieval instruments.

Aimed to

The course is intended for singers, instrumentalists, choir conductors and singers, music teachers, conservatory teachers, musicologists, medievalists, music lovers. It is open to people who already know medieval music as well as to those who are new to it and therefore have no previous knowledge.

Those who wish to enroll and do not own a medieval instrument please do contact the course direction to see the possibilities of accessing to instruments.

Instrumentalists who do have medieval instruments and would like to participate, but whose instrument does not appear in the list of instruments taught, please contact the course management to find out about the possibilities of participating in the course.
